In alternating years, this excellence-based grant is aimed to help fund one graduate student and one non-tenure-track scholar for a period of two years, covering SFRA membership costs. [Note: This notice corrects the earlier SNS call; for 2023-'24, we are supporting **Track A** applicants (graduate students), **not Track B** applicants (non-tenure-track Ph.D.s) as previously mentioned.]

- Eligible candidates must be students currently registered for a graduate degree program
 (Masters / Doctoral) in a recognized institution of higher education.
 - Eligible candidates may not be employed as tenured faculty or in academic tenure-track posts for the duration of their participation in the program.
 - Candidates may apply more than once for the program but can only be awarded one time (no matter which track).
 - Awarded scholars are encouraged to attend the SFRA conference (in person or hybrid) during the years they participate in the program.
