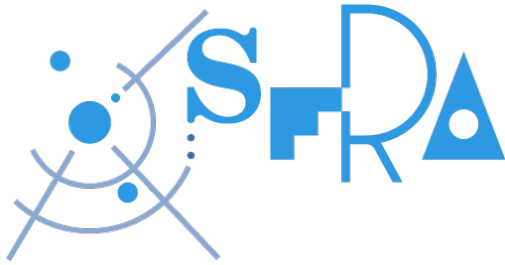
We are pleased to post a call for applications for graduate students towards the **SFRA Support a New Scholar Program (SNS)**, for 2025-2026.

- Eligible candidates must be in a graduate-degree program of an accredited university, preferably in a doctoral program.
- Eligible candidates may not be employed as tenured faculty, or in academic tenure-track positions, for the duration of their participation in the program.
- Candidates may apply more than once for the program, but can only be awarded one time (no matter which track).
- Awarded scholars are encouraged to attend the SFRA conference (in person or hybrid) during the years they participate in the program.
